#### PROCEEDINGS OF THE MEETING OF HIGH POWER COMMITTEE HELD ON 11.12.2019 AT 11.00A.M.UNDER THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF **GOVERNMENT** THE COMMISSIONER-CUM-SECRETARY IN TO CONFERENCE HALL, DEPARTMENT OF SCHOOL & MASS EDUCATION.

A meeting of High Power Committee was held on 11.12.2019 at 11.00 A.M. under the chairmanship of Commissioner-cum-Secretary to Government, Department of Higher Education for consideration of the proposals regarding grant of permission/recognition in respect of Non-Government Colleges/Institutions under Section 5 and 6 of Orissa Education Act, 1969.

- (A) The High Power Committee perused the detailed agenda notes, discussed elaborately on the fresh proposals received from various Educational Agencies for the academic session 2020-21 and various reports received from Prescribed Authorities. The Committee expressed its concern over mushrooming growth of private colleges in the state, most of which lack required infrastructure and faculty; which ultimately affects the quality of education being imparted in such institutes. In order to put a stop to further deterioration of quality of higher education, the Committee unanimously took the following policy decisions.
  - i) For academic year 2020-21, applications for increase of seats, opening of new streams/subjects/courses (including PG courses) in respect of Autonomous colleges only shall be considered and be referred to Joint inspection. Applications of non-autonomous colleges shall not be considered. While considering applications for opening new PG courses, guidelines framed by Prof. A.K. Das, Vice Chairman, OSHEC shall be followed.
  - ii) For academic year 2021-22 and beyond, the minimum NAAC CGPA score 2.01 shall be the pre-requisite for any existing degree or professional college/institution to apply for increase of seats/opening of new streams/subjects/courses (including PG courses). In case of non-availability of NAAC score, the college/institution must have been ranked by NIRF within top 200 institutions of the country in its respective category. In the absence of both NAAC and NIRF score/ ranking, at least one-third of the programmes of the college/institution must have been accredited by National Board of Accreditation (NBA).
  - iii) Permission for opening of any new degree or professional college shall not be granted for a period of 5 years, i.e., from academic year 2020-21 to 2025-26. However, exception can be made in case the educational agency (proposing to establish a new college) is a nationally or internationally acclaimed provider of higher education.

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- iv) Applications pertaining to grant of Permanent Recognition of existing colleges (i.e. colleges existing as on 11.12.2019) will however be considered and be referred to Joint Inspection.
- v) Notwithstanding what is mentioned at para A(i to iv) above, applications for opening new courses related to Agriculture and Public Health shall be encouraged and the committee authorized the Chairman, HPC to refer the proposals to OUAT and AIPH respectively for a report. On getting a favourable recommendation from the OUAT/AIPH, it will be placed before the HPC for a decision.
- vi) The decisions taken in the HPC meeting dated 12.06.2019 are superceded to the extent mentioned at para (i) to (v) above.
- vii) Higher Education Department shall maintain the list of colleges having due permission/recognition/affiliation in its website and should publish newspaper advertisements regularly in this regard so that parents/students can take appropriate decision and can avoid taking admission in colleges not having permission/recognition/affiliation.
- **(B)** In order to streamline the joint inspections (with reference to H.E. Department letter No. 20357/HE, dated 30.09.2019), the Committee took the following decisions.
  - i) Joint inspection by the Prescribed Authorities and University Authorities shall be conducted by a team which shall consist of one or two representatives from the respective University and one representative of the respective Prescribed Authority.
  - ii) Hired vehicle expenses for Joint Inspection team visit shall be borne by the Universities.
  - iii) The Joint Inspection dateline in respect of referred proposals of HPC meeting held on 12.06.2019 is extended from 31.12.2019 to 31.01.2020 as some joint inspections cannot be completed by 31.12.2019.
  - iv) Joint Inspection Team, in its report, must give a clear-cut remark such as "Recommended", "Not recommended" and "Deferred". Photograph in support of Joint Inspection must be uploaded with the online report.
- **(C)** The decisions taken in the meeting are given below.

#### Item No.1. Post-facto Approval

The Committee accorded post-facto approval to the 04(four) nos. of letters issued by the H.E. Department earlier in favour of 04 nos. colleges as at **Annexure-A**. (Page-6)

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## Item No.2. <u>Applications for increase of seats, opening of new streams/subjects/courses</u> (including PG courses) from the academic year 2020-21

As per the policy decision taken at Part A(i), proposals recommended by Joint Inspection Team and submitted through online in respect Autonomous Colleges only are allowed by the HPC. Further, new applications received through online from educational agencies in respect of autonomous colleges only are considered to be referred for Joint Inspection. All other applications/proposals are rejected. However, applications/proposals for opening of Agriculture or Public Health will be dealt as per the decision taken at Part A(v).

The list of applications/proposals, that are allowed by the HPC & shortlisted for joint inspection are given at **Annexure-B.**(Page-7 to 8).

## Item No.3. <u>Proposals for establishment of new Degree/Professional colleges, for the academic year 2020-21</u>

As per the policy decision taken at Part A(iii), the proposals and the new applications for establishment of new Degree/Professional Colleges are rejected.

#### Item No.4. Proposals/applications relating to Permanent Recognition

As per the policy decision taken at Part A(iv), proposals for grant of Permanent Recognition recommended by Joint Inspection Team and submitted through online are allowed by the HPC. Pending Joint Inspection, in respect of Permanent Recognition, be conducted by 31.01.2020 where Joint Inspection could not be completed. Further, new applications received through online from educational agencies are considered to be referred for Joint Inspection.

The list of proposals, that are allowed by the HPC are given at **Annexure- C.**(Page- 9 to 12).

## Item No.5. Joint Inspection to check whether institutions are imparting Quality Education or not

The decision on the random Joint Inspection Reports received from Regional Director of Education, Sambalpur, Berhmapur & Bhubaneswar in respect of colleges where increase of seats were allowed in the last (03)three years as per the decision of last HPC on the meeting held on 12.06.2019 are at **Annexure-D.**(Page-13 to14).

#### Item No.6. Any other matter

i) The proposal of DHE(O),BBSR vide L.No. 37450 dated 01.10.2019 for rectification of the number of seats of the BBA course of Ispat (Auto.) College, Rourkela, i.e., for grant of Permanent Recognition from the session 2016-17 to the BBA course with 32 seats instead of 30 seats, is allowed.

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ii) It is clarified that in case of extension of opening permission to a particular educational institution which fails to start within 45 days from commencement of a particular academic year as per the opening permission order, the Prescribed Authority is competent enough, as per the Section 5(10) of the Orissa Education Act,1969, to extend the opening permission for a period not exceeding beyond the 1<sup>st</sup> day of the following academic year.
