Sanction of grant in-aid in favour of different
Non-Government educational institutions.

Sir,

I am directed to say that while processing proposals received from the Director, Higher Education with regard to sanction of grant-in-aid in favour of un aided non-Govt. educational institutions/posts in aided educational institutions doubts were raised in certain quarters as to whether any gap within the qualifying period could be condoned and whether grant-in-aid can be sanctioned against the post which has completed the qualifying period after 1.6.94. Government after careful consideration have decided as follows:

(1) The intention underlying the grant-in-aid order is that for a post to be eligible for grant-in-aid, it must have been filled up for the full qualifying period of five years or three years as the case may be by a regularly recruited person possessing requisite qualifications. This stipulation has been made with a view to ensuring that the educational agencies act run properly set up educational institutions for five years or three years as the case may be before asking for grant-in-aid. Unless this stipulation is made a number of fraudulent colleges are likely to come up and the students will be exploited. The grant-in-aid order does not provide for condonation of an within the qualifying period and therefore, there is no scope allowing such condonation. In fact as a matter of policy provisions for such condonation will also be discriminatory. Therefore, provisions of the grant-in-aid order should be worked out as

(ii) With regard to the other problem raised as to whether a post which qualifies for approval subsequent to the date of application can be taken into consideration, it is a misconception to believe that the grant-in-aid order provides for calling for applications. Under the provisions of the grant-in-aid order submission of application is a continuing process and as and when an institution or post in an institution qualifies for receiving grant-in-aid applications have to be submitted in the prescribed Form. Application in Form 'A' is required to be submitted within three months from the date of completion of qualifying period of eligibility. Similarly, application in Form 'B' is required to be made within three months from the date of eligibility of a post for approval. So long as application have been made keeping in view the provision of Para-7(2) and Para-9(3) there is no difficulty for considering the applications for sanction of grant-in-aid in favour of different post which complete the qualifying period subsequent to 1.6.94.
