**PROCEEDINGS OF THE HIGH POWER COMMITTEE
CONSTITUTED VIDE GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATION NO.
15641/HE., DT. 01.05.2005 HELD ON 21.01.2006 AT 11.00 A.M. IN
THE CONFERENCE HALL OF HIGHER EDUCATION
DEPARTMENT**

A meeting of the High Power Committee was held in the Conference hall of the Higher Education Department under the chairmanship of Commissioner-cum-Secretary to Govt., to consider the applications of general colleges, professional colleges and law college for grant of temporary/permanent recognition under Section 5 and 6 of the Orissa Education Act, 1969 .

The Commissioner-cum-Secretary to Government, Deptt. of Higher Education, Orissa –cum- Chairman of the Committee desired to know about the details of the proposals received from the RDEs. and Director, Higher Education for consideration of temporary/permanent recognition in respect of general courses, professional courses and law college from various private educational institutions. The Committee members were informed that altogether 20 proposals relating to temporary / permanent recognition have been received in the Deptt. for consideration by the H.P.C. After detailed discussions on the items as per the agenda, the following decisions were taken in favour of different educational institutions and different courses.

Temporary /Permanent Recognition to +2 and +3 Colleges

1. Two proposals for grant of 1st temporary recognition including one for +2 and one for +3 college received from RDE, Bhubaneswar were taken up for consideration. Besides, four proposals including two for +2 and two for +3 colleges were received from RDE Bhubaneswar for grant of permanent recognition. As regards the grant of permanent recognition to two +3 colleges, the committee decided to withdraw the conditions earlier imposed while granting permanent recognition as those deficiencies /conditions have been fulfilled in the mean time. During the discussion, the Committee observed that institutions are running without land and buildings constructed over own land, such educational institution which don't have their own building constructed over land owned by them will not admit students from the session 2006-07. The list of colleges allowed / deferred for grant of temporary/ permanent recognition is placed at **Annexure-A.**
2. **Temporary Recognition to Professional Colleges**

Altogether thirteen proposals were received from Director, Higher Education in respect of private professional institutions. During discussion, the Committee observed that some institutions are running in rented buildings and not fulfilling the stipulated conditions as per provision of Act. Hence

such institutions should be instructed not to admit students from the session 2006-07. Further, it was decided that for Post Graduate courses, the faculty members should have M.Phil/Ph.D qualifications. The list of colleges allowed / deferred for grant of temporary recognition is placed at Annexure-B.


3. Law College

Proposal for grant of permanent recognition for the session 2004-05 in respect of Biraja Law college received from DHE was taken up for consideration. After detailed discussion the committee decided to reject the proposal as the college authority do not have ownership in respect of the required extent of land and have not been able to produce ROR (Patta) in their favour even after a lapse of 15 years till date. Moreover, the Governing Body as per norms has also not been constituted for the college.

The college is strictly prohibited from admitting the students from the session 2006-07. However recognition is accorded only for the purpose of allowing the students enrolled during 2003-04 and 2004-05 to appear in the university examination.

4. Issue of withdrawal of recognition in respect of ten (+2) colleges as per list furnished by Director, Higher Education was discussed. Commissioner-cum-Secretary advised that show cause notice in respect of each college should be issued separately and the reply received from the said college should be examined by Director, Higher Education and views furnished for further action by Govt.

The meeting ended with vote of thanks to chair.
